This half-day programme examines the environmental issues we as a conservation charity experience on the Water of Leith. The class engages in a guided walk with activities and field studies along the river and Union Canal to look at water quality and pollution, managing invasives, and promoting biodiversity.

On the Day

The education officer introduces the class to environmental issues on the river with a PowerPoint presentation on the plants and animals on the river, the human history of the river and the work by the Trust to manage the river with partner agencies. The following topics are included: pollution, biological oxygen demand, ecological balance, habitat disruption, indicator species, sampling, kick samples. The education officer then leads the class on a guided walk along the river and the Union Canal where the class interprets data from a pollution 'hotspot;' kick samples to survey water quality; and surveys the presence of an invasive plant (this varies according the time of year).

All adults and children should come dressed for the weather in comfortable outdoor clothing with sturdy footwear that they don't mind getting muddy. All pupils entering the river will need to wear wellies. If you would like to borrow wellies, it saves a lot of time on the day if you send any welly sizes to the education officer in advance. For pupils aged 16 upwards we have some waders which they are welcome to borrow.

The class returns to the Centre by 12.45 pm and they are welcome to stay on in the classroom to eat lunch before returning to school.
