In Woodland Places, pupils learn about the plants and animals living in the woodlands and by the river and consider how they depend upon each other for survival. They investigate life cycles and food chains as well as the importance of plants to life on earth. The programme is seasonally adapted and available year-round.

Curriculum Links

Explore the rich diversity of woodland habitats, investigate life cycles and food chains, consider the adaptations of woodland plants and animals and understand the importance of plants to life on earth. Activities: interactive exhibition, sensory and discovery walk, surveys and art workshop.

On the Day

Pupils engage in classroom activities and explore our interactive exhibition and quiz to learn about the wildlife and human history of the river. They will explore the woodlands on a guided walk led by our teacher which will include tree identification, creative writing and bug hunting. In the afternoon the pupils participate in a woodlands-themed art project to take back to school.

All adults and children should come dressed for the weather in comfortable outdoor clothing with sturdy footwear that they don't mind getting muddy.
