## ABOUT WATER OF LEITH CONSERVATION TRUST

Founded in 1988, the Water of Leith Conservation Trust's mission is to conserve and enhance the Water of Leith as a haven for biodiversity and be an educational and recreational resource for all. As Scotland's first river charity and guardians of the river, we strive to raise the profile of this key environmental asset and promote community action to help the river.

The Water of Leith flows over 24 miles from its source in the Pentland Hills to the Firth of Forth in Leith. Its journey can be followed for 12 3/4 miles (18 km) from Balerno to Leith along the Water of Leith Walkway. The river and walkway pass through many sites of historic and environmental interest, and offer a range of recreational opportunities including walking, cycling, angling and wildlife watching. The river and walkway are a very important local resource and one of Edinburgh's key tourist attractions.

To protect this valuable asset the Trust carries out the following:

- Operate the Water of Leith Visitor Centre as an educational visitor attraction and community resource.
- Enable volunteers and the public to take practical action to conserve and enhance the natural and built environment
- Promote the sustainable use and management of the river.

#### **ROLE DESCRIPTION**

We are looking for a reliable, flexible, and enthusiastic individual for this unique opportunity to support the delivery and development of a comprehensive programme of conservation work and public engagement along the Water of Leith.

The main duties will include:

Working with the Conservation Team to deliver a weekly programme of conservation tasks with the Trust's Volunteer team including the delivery of clean - ups, river patrols, practical work days, INNS treatment tasks, walkway maintenance, habitat management and enhancement projects



Help to deliver an effective programme of community conservation action along the river. This will include working with corporate groups, youths, adults with special needs and the public.

Support the Water of Leith Conservation Trust staff team with additional educational activities including informal education groups, summer events programme, nature club, birthday parties and adult talks\*

Assist with Visitor Centre organisation – support of reception volunteer, opening/closing, cashing up, customer service and refreshment provision when on duty.

Assist with all media promotions and aim to raise awareness of the conservation programme and celebrate the efforts of volunteer's roles, this includes the development online resources, posting to social media and producing content for newsletters and blogs

Participate in work place training to develop personal skills.

Work within the all Trust's policies and procedures, ensuring all Risk Assessments, Health and Safety, Environmental Policy Statement and Child Protection and Welfare Policies are fully implemented.

## SUPPORT AND TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES

This placement is part of a national programme - New to Nature - funded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund. This will include additional elements of training and personal development support provided by Groundwork UK and partners, as well as on the job training and support from the Water of Leith Conservation Trust

Each young person will complete an in-depth induction programme with input from The Prince Trust, along with tailored advice and guidance from a Groundwork Youth Employment Coach at key points during the placement. This may include identifying skills and training opportunities or help with your CV and job search skills.

The Water of Leith Conservation Trust will also be providing support for participants, including: First Aid, Food Hygiene and Safety, Health and Safety and Risk Assessment Training, various opportunities to learn more about nature and the environment

All young people on the New to Nature programme, will be invited to participate in a learning Network. This will create opportunities to take part in different talks, workshops and discussions focused on the environment sector, hosted by Groundwork and our partners.
