Come to the ancient woodlands of the Craiglockhart Dells to earn the Adventure section of the JASS award. This outdoor programme develops survival skills by purifying water, hunting for food, and building a shelter and fire. Learn about the plants and animals in the woods and river and contribute to the health of the river by participating in a conservation challenge.

The class explores our interactive exhibition area to learn more about the woods and the river. They then spend the rest of the morning outside on a series of survival challenges. After lunch (in the classroom or outdoors) they either complete a conservation activity or follow a trail in the woods. All adults and children should come dressed for the weather in comfortable outdoor clothing with sturdy footwear that they don't mind getting muddy.
